

LISE GRENIER

Sgt. Lise Grenier is the Provincial Motorcycle Coordinator, Ontario Provincial Police; President of Ontario Association of Police Motorcycle Instructors and Ride Master for the OPP Golden Helmets Motorcycle Precision Riding Team.



She was hired onto the OPP (Ontario Provincial Police) Force in 1988 and in 1992, into the motorcycle program. After learning to pick up an 850 pound Harley-Davidson Police Special on the first day of her course, she learned to ride through every

road surface, grass, sand, asphalt, bushes, trees - any conceivable situation that could come up during enforcement.

In 1997 she became a member of the elite OPP Golden Helmets Precision Riding Team and in 1999, became a Police Motorcycle Instructor, another first for a woman.

Lise became heavily involved in the Ontario Association of Police Motorcycle Instructors and is now the president. In 1999, the group established The Great Lakes Police Motorcycle Training Seminar an event with a competitive component for police officers on motorcycles to improve their riding skills. It attracts officers from across Canada and United States. She's placed in the top 10 in the Skills-Expert-Fairing class since 2008.

In 2007, she was promoted to Provincial Motorcycle Coordinator, responsible for ensuring that all police motorcycles have been properly equipped so the officers can do their jobs. In addition to being the Ride Master for the Golden Helmets, she's also in charge of VIP escorts and has escorted such notables as the Pope, the Queen, Lady Diana and Prince Charles in 1991.
